Theme Sharing

Servant of the Lord (24th Sunday in Ordinary Time)

Isaiah's song on the "Servant of the Lord" in the first reading does not expressly refer to the Messiah. However, the subsequent songs do paint a clearer picture of the identity of the Servant. Isaiah foretells the suffering of the Servant who will show extraordinary courage and firmness in the face of adversities as he puts his trust in the saving power of the Lord God.

In the gospel, Jesus asks his disciples and then his apostles: "Who do people say that I am?" After Peter replies that he is the Messiah, Jesus begins to tell the apostles about his suffering, death and resurrection. And whoever wishes to become his disciple must first deny oneself and abandon the human desires of worldly gains, success and control over others. One must take up his own cross to follow Christ. Therefore, we must bear in mind Jesus' important teaching that we are called to love. God is Love. He creates us and imparts his love on us so that we can all live in love.

In the second reading, James reminds us that our faith must be reflected in our actions He asks: "what good is it if you say you have faith and yet you do not have works (of charity)? Can faith save you?" In his letter to the Galatians, Paul further says, "In Christ Jesus, it matters not if one is circumcised or uncircumcised; it is faith working through love that counts." In other words, our faith must be backed up by acts of love, without which our faith will simply wither and die.

2015 Year Of Consecrated Life

Apostolic Letter From His Holiness –Pope Francis

1. Aim of the Year of Consecrated Life
A. The first of these aims is to look to the past with gratitude. All our Institutes are heir to a history rich in charisms. At their origins we see the hand of God who, in his Spirit, calls certain individuals to follow Christ more closely, to translate the Gospel into a particular way of life, to read the signs of the times with the eyes of faith and to respond creatively to the needs of the Church. This initial experience then matured and developed, engaging new members in new

geographic and cultural contexts, and giving rise to new ways of exercising the charism, new initiatives and expressions of apostolic charity. Like the seed which becomes a tree, each Institute grew and stretched out its branches.

During this Year, it would be appropriate for each charismatic family to reflect on its origins and history, in order to thank God who grants the Church a variety of gifts which embellish her and equip her for every good work (cf. Lumen Gentium, 12). Recounting our history is essential for preserving our identity, for strengthening our unity as a family and our common sense of belonging. More than an exercise in archaeology or the cultivation of mere nostalgia, it calls for following in the footsteps of past generations in order to grasp the high ideals, and the vision and values which inspired them, beginning with the founders and foundresses and the first communities. In this way we come to see how the charism has been lived over the years, the creativity it has sparked, the difficulties it encountered and the concrete ways those difficulties were surmounted. We may also encounter cases of inconsistency, the result of human weakness and even at times a neglect of some essential aspects of the charism. Yet everything proves instructive and, taken as a whole, acts as a summons to conversion. To tell our story is to praise God and to thank him for all his aifts. To Be Continued

Exaltation of the Holy Cross -Feast September 14

On the next day, the Lord's holy cross was exhibited in the church, for public veneration. These stories became the source of this feast. The special prayers for this day's Mass concentrate on the mystery of the Cross: Christ died on the cross, and thus brought us eternal salvation.

General Instruction Of The Roman Missal: The Duties and Ministries in the Mass

-A priest also, who possesses within the

Church the power of Holy Orders to offer sacrifice in the person of Christ,[81] stands for this reason at the head of the faithful people gathered together here and now, presides over their prayer, proclaims the message of salvation to them, associates the people with himself in the offering of sacrifice through Christ in the Holy Spirit to God the Father, gives his brothers and sisters the Bread of eternal life, and partakes of it with them. When he celebrates the Eucharist, therefore, he must serve God and the people with dignity and humility, and by his bearing and by the way he says the divine words he must convey to the faithful the living presence of Christ. -After the priest, the deacon, in virtue of the sacred ordination he has received, holds first place among those who minister in the Eucharistic Celebration. For the sacred Order of the diaconate has been held in high honor in the Church even from the time of the Apostles.[82] At Mass the deacon has his own part in proclaiming the Gospel, in preaching God's word from time to time, in announcing the intentions of the Prayer of the Faithful, in ministering to the priest, in preparing the altar and serving the celebration of the Sacrifice, in distributing the Eucharist to the faithful, especially under the species of wine, and sometimes in giving directions regarding the people's gestures and posture.
