# Theme Sharing

Your Sins Are Forgiven
Today is the 11th Sunday in Ordinary
Time. The gospel is on a story familiar to us:
a sinful city woman weeping before Jesus,
wiping her tears away from Jesus' feet with
her hairs, kissing them and anointing them
with expensive ointment. Simon, a
Pharisee who has invited Jesus to his house
is apparently uneasy and skeptical that his
prophet-like guest should so receive the
woman. Jesus therefore tells a parable of
the two debtors to dispel the doubt of Simon
and to demonstrate God's mercy to sinners
who have repented.

In the first reading, King David had committed grave sins of murder and adultery. God therefore sent the prophet Nathan to admonish David. David repented and acknowledged his sinfulness. Thereupon his sins were forgiven.

The two stories on forgiveness of sin still hold true today. God has not wavered in his attitude towards sinners. As long as there is repentance, there is forgiveness. The two examples may help us to reflect on our habit of going to confession.

A lot of Christians are reluctant to go to confession because they don't have a clear understanding about the Sacrament of Penance. Using human intellect to ponder God's work, they liken confession as going to court as if God is the judge ready to pronounce judgment and mete out punishment. However, confession is truly an act of reconciliation with God, an act of faith and devotion that should be conducted in an atmosphere of joy and reverence. This is why the Church, after the Second Vatican Council, introduces the penitential rites during a communal celebration. This is set out in the Catechism of the Catholic Church below:

"The sacrament of Penance can also take place in the framework of a communal celebration in which we prepare ourselves together for confession and give thanks together for the forgiveness received. Here, the personal confession of sins and individual absolution are inserted into a liturgy of the word of God

with readings and a homily, an examination of conscience conducted in common, a communal request for forgiveness, the Our Father and a thanksgiving in common. The

communal celebration expresses more clearly the ecclesial character of penance. However, regardless of its manner of celebration, the sacrament of Penance is always, by its very nature, a liturgical action, and therefore an ecclesial and public action." In these communal celebrations of Penitential Rites, personal confession and individual absolution are still retained (except in the case of grave necessity which will not be discussed here). However, it highlights the ecclesial nature of the sacrament of Penance and truly restores the meaning of the sacrament. The sacrament of Penance is a sacrament of reconciliation; an event of humanity reconciling with God that should rightly be held as a liturgical action of the Church with joy and reverence.

# **Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy**

## This Is His name "Merciful God"

Finally, the Lord proclaims Himself "abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness." How lovely is this description of God! Everything is here, because God is great and powerful, but His greatness and power are displayed in loving us, we who are so little, so incapable. The word "love" used here indicates affection, grace and goodness. It is not the love of soap operas ... It is love that takes the first step, which does not depend on human merits but is of immense gratuitousness. It is the divine solicitude that nothing can stop, not even sin, because it is able to go beyond sin, to overcome evil and forgive it.

A "faithfulness" without limits: here is the last word of God's revelation to Moses. God's faithfulness never fails. Because the Lord is the Guardian that, as the Psalm says, does not fall asleep but watches constantly over us to lead us to life:

"He will not allow your foot to slip; or your guardian to sleep. Behold, the guardian of Israel never slumbers nor sleeps. The LORD will guard you from all evil; he will guard your soul.

The LORD will guard your coming and going both now and forever."

And this merciful God is faithful in His mercy and Saint Paul says a lovely thing: if you are not faithful to Him, He will remain faithful because he cannot deny Himself.
Faithfulness in mercy is proper to God's being. And therefore God is totally and

always trustworthy — a solid and stable presence. This is the certainty of our faith. And then, in this Jubilee of Mercy, we entrust ourselves totally to Him, and experience the joy of being loved by this "God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness." Pope Francis

They asked her, "Did you throw any stone at the king?" The woman's face showed how terrified she was, so the quard forcefully told her that she would be punished. The woman was arrested and presented before the King. She trembled with immense fear and prayed that they would not kill her. After seeing the blood flow down the King's face, she became more upset and felt hopeless. "What will happen to me?" she thought. The king, very calmly asked her, "Did you throw the stone at me?" She replied, "Your majesty, I threw the stone at the mango tree." "Why?" the king asked. She replied weeping, "Your majesty, my child has been starving for two days. ## Read More Know More

We Don't Really Eat Christ's Body...or Do We

When you understand that, you get a little better understanding of people who go to Mass every day. They're not just going to sit down, stand up, mumble prayers and kneel. They're going to receive the body, blood, soul and divinity of Christ. They're going to drink Him into their lives, literally, so that He remains present to them.

They're going so that, with Him constantly present, they'll be better

able to love as He loves. They'll be stronger Christians and live better lives. They don't go because they're really good people. At least that's not why I go. I go because I need a lot of help.

All of this tells us something about how we should approach Communion. He said, "Do this in remembrance of Me." Not "Do this thinking about your homework," or "Do this without paying attention."

Receiving the Eucharist is a profound act. It's as close as you'll get to God in this life. If we want to receive all the benefit we can from it, we need to have the right attitude. Our approach needs to be prayerful, respectful and reverent. We also need to approach the Eucharist "clean." We can't just sin all week, and then expect to receive the body and blood of

Receiving worthily means that going to Him with a clear conscience.

Christ.

If you've committed a serious sin which you haven't confessed, to go to Communion would be another serious sin. It's a "slap in the face" to God. Far from strengthening your faith, receiving Communion unworthily will diminish it. I believe it was Voltaire who said that the way to lose your faith is to commit a serious sin and then go to Communion. It's a "grace drain" and it's really wrong.

So the Eucharist is serious business. It's the

best thing we have going in our day to day life - - constant, ongoing contact with the living God. It's our "daily bread" that nourishes our spiritual life.

It provides our USDRA of grace.

Don't take the Eucharist lightly. Pay attention to the consecration.

Something really incredible is happening. And don't settle for "starvation rations." Receive the Eucharist often. It's your spiritual food. You need it.

## 天主的名字是慈悲

上主自稱"富於慈愛忠誠"。天主的這一稱號是多 美啊!這句話意味深遠,因為天主偉大而有力,但這偉大和有力祂卻用來愛我們,我們是如此弱小、如此無能。此處使用的"慈愛"一詞表明情感、恩寵及仁慈,它不是電視劇中的愛情。愛先走出第一步,愛不是憑人的功勞獲取,而是天主,限的白白賜予。愛是天主的一份熱心腸,任何事物,甚至罪都阻擋不住天主的愛,因為天主曉得越過罪,戰勝惡並予以寬恕。

無止境的"忠誠":這是天主啓示給梅瑟的最後一個詞。天主的忠誠絕不會減少,因為上主是保護者,一如《聖詠》所說的,祂不打盹,而是一直"港我們,為把我們帶向生命:"祂決不讓你的脚滑倒;保護你的也決不睡覺。看,那保護以色列者,不可也不有更大。上主保護你於任何災患,上主保護你的心靈平安。上主保護你出外,保護你回來,從現在起一直到永遠"。

這個慈悲的天主忠於祂的慈悲,聖保 禄說得好:如果我們不忠信,祂仍然 是忠信的,因為祂不能否認自己(弟 後二13)。在慈悲上忠信正是天主的本 性。因此,天主是完全及始終忠信的。 祂的臨在堅實穩固,這就是我們信仰 的可靠保障。在這慈悲禧年當中,但 願我們完全仰賴天主,體驗到蒙受這 "慈悲寬仁、緩於發怒、富於慈愛忠 誠的天主"所愛的喜樂。

# 靈修小故事

## 水終有澄清的一天!

在我童年居住的三合院裡,沿著屋檐 滴水的溝槽下,擺了一排大水缸。水 缸有半人高,缸口大到雙手不能環抱 過來,是為了接盛從屋頂流下來的雨 水。

剛下過雨的水缸是渾濁的,放一些明 礬進去,等個兩三天,水就會慢慢地 清澈。因此,媽媽嚴格規定我們不能 去玩缸裡的水。可是,不玩自己家的 水,並不表示別人不玩別人家的水。 我們家正好在去中學必經的路上,每 天有成百上千的學生走過。有一些喜 歡惡作劇的孩子,路過的時候就會突 然沖進院子,每個水缸都攪一下,然 後呼嘯著跑走。

可惡的舉動,使我們又憤怒,又緊張。為了防止水被弄渾,我們終日都坐在院子裡,等待惡作劇的孩子。媽媽看我們被水缸弄得心神不寧,就安慰我們說:"你們的心比水缸的水還容易混亂。那些惡作劇的孩子,根本不用理,時間一久,他們自然就覺得沒什麼好玩了。做自己該做的事,水,終有澄清的一天。"

"水終有澄清的一天!"媽媽的教 海,常常在我被誤解、扭曲、誣陷的 時刻,從水缸中浮現出來。我的心像 水一樣容易混亂,但在混亂之際,不 需要過度的緊張和辯白,需要的是安 靜如實的生活。當我們的心清明,水 缸的水自然就澄清了。

每次走過鄉下的三合院,童年院子裡的水缸都歷歷在目,就會想到一個潔身自愛的人,他的心境就如水缸裡的水,來自天地,自然澄清。生命中的曲解,是一時一刻的,智慧與心境的

清明追求,卻是生生世世的。 一秒鐘的混亂,可能要三天才能清明,但祇要我們能夠邁向更高的境界,水,終有澄清的一天。

# 知多一點點

與基督相遇 -- 聖體聖事 聖體聖事是合一共融的標記

所謂「合一共融」, 是指兩個層面: 一個是縱線的, 是指天主與人的合一 共融; 另一個是橫線的, 是指人與 人之間的合一共融。

天主與人合一共融相信尚未忘記,創 世紀中所記載人類的原祖破壞了天主 與人之間的共融,而失去了天主子女 的地位。所以,天主才派遣耶穌降生 成人,拯救人類。天主使有過錯的人 與祂合一,大可不必使用這方法,但 是,祂卻用這最能具體地表達愛的行 動來完成拯救人類的工作: 耶穌的降 生成人,最後死在十字架上。在他與 門徒吃最後晚餐時,為了要與人類長 相守, 永不分離, 他立了聖體聖事。 將自己隱藏在麵酒形中, 進入信友心 中,與他們生活在一起,這是一個最 大的合一共融的方法。既透過有形的 物質・藉著感官領受了耶穌・繼而在 人靈上發生內在的效果,與主耶穌結 合。透過這結合,我們便被提昇到進 入與天父共融合一的境界;因爲耶穌 說:「就如父派遣了我,我因父而生 活; 照樣,那吃我的人,也要因我而 生活。」(若.6: 57) 所以說,聖體聖 事是天人合一共融的標記。

人與人合一共融由橫的一面看,一如 最後晚餐時,是十二位宗徒一同吃永 生的食糧。今天,我們在感恩祭中,亦 分享同一的聖體神糧,因著來自同一

基督的愛,使我們成為天父的子女,彼此都是兄弟姊妹。每次領聖體時,我們是與十字架上犧牲的基督結合;每一次都能增加我們與天主的新關係,與此同時,也拉近了與其他基督徒相互間的關係。這都是聖體聖事留給我們的最具體、最有效的方法。聖體聖事的神恩

領聖體是我們與基督完全結合,成為 基督肢體的聖事標記。就是說:透過 「領聖體」這有形的行動,來完成我們與基督的實在合一共融。同時,由於基督的親臨,給予我們無比的勇力,去面對生活的挑戰,使我們的生活在基督內成了祭品,一同獻給天主聖父。因此,我們不僅是在領聖體時與基督結合,更將這結合於生活中延續下去,將這份恩寵活出來,發揮效用。結語

聖體聖事是基督在十字架上的祭獻; 同時也是我們與基督結合,和他一齊 奉上給天父的祭獻; 因為當基督藉著 聖體聖事與我們合而為一時,他使我 們的生活在他內成為天父悅納的祭 獻。所以,聖體聖事是基督徒入門聖 事的高峰,是天人合一共融的國滿標 記。

\*聖體聖事是耶穌親定的至尊聖事:將 餅酒變爲自己的血內,獻給天主,養 活人靈,滋養、聖化人的超性生命。 撮要

聖經中有多處地方預言和記述有 關聖體聖事的事蹟:舊約中的「瑪納」, 天主在曠野降瑪納養活以色列人。這 瑪納就是聖體神糧的象徵。新約中耶 穌多次預言聖體聖事: 用五餅二魚飽 饗了五千人; 若望福音中生命之糧的 言論。

當神父在祭台上說:「這是我的身體」「這是我的血」時,餅和酒便變成了基督的聖體聖血,這是一個信德的奧蹟。
